Background

Technology innovation has long been a national priority for both the Science & Technology and the Higher Education sectors for sustainable development of China. In recent years, nurturing of young talents in universities for innovations and entrepreneurial ventures has become a main stream issue for education development in higher education.

Supported by policies and incubation programs with abundant seed funds, young graduates in China are enticed to have a foretaste of techno-preneurship, not only for developing a different career, but also for accelerating academic-based knowledge transfer. On the other hand, the practice in cultivating entrepreneurial thinking, behavior and actions for knowledge transfer takes on different forms and manifestation in different regions, and among schools. There appears to be no commonly accepted best practice or even metrics to gauge success beyond the convention quantitative measure on number of ventures, their revenue and survival rate over time.

In this context, ISTA wishes to organize a half-day forum on "Innovation & Entrepreneurship for Technology Transfer" in conjunction with its 2012 Executive Committee meeting. The forum aims to facilitate discussions and sharing among the participants on current state policies, prevailing international practices, and illustrative cases of emergent models with emphasis on social responsibility of entrepreneurship under the prevailing thinking of "do well do good" advocated by social entrepreneurship practitioners.
